

On Ice Piccadilly Event Information

Recommended Clothing

Skaters are strongly advised to wear gloves while on the ice. Long socks are also recommended. A selection of gloves will be on sale from the on site Box Office.

Food and Drink

A selection of drinks and snacks will be available from the KRO On Ice chalet.

Disabled Access

The ice rink arena is accessible to wheelchair users and there is a ramp in place to gain access to the ice rink. The On Ice staff are available to assist. Organisers recommend that wheelchair users are accompanied onto the ice by a competent skater. Disabled toilet facilities are available on site.

On Ice Rules

Entry onto the rink structure signifies agreement to the following conditions. The conditions require visitors to observe these and other statements or directives displayed on the premises

SKATING IS A SPORT WITH INHERENT RISKS AND SKATING AND ANY ON ICE ACTIVITY IS AT YOUR OWN RISK

1. The rink suppliers, ice management company and/or Manchester City Council will not accept claims for injuries obtained while visiting the ice rink.
2. You must possess a ticket, which must be produced for access onto the ice rink.
3. Children 12 and under must be accompanied on site by a parent or guardian. Children aged 8 and under must be accompanied on the ice and at all times by a parent or guardian.
4. The event organisers reserve the right to refuse admission or eject any person for whatever reason. Persons will not be admitted if in the opinion of the stewards, they are under the influence of alcohol or an illegal substance.
5. CCTV is in use with images recorded for the purpose of crime prevention and safety.
6. You must observe the following conditions, while on the ice.
 - Only skaters will be permitted on to the ice
 - Make sure your skates are correctly fastened

- Rink marshals and event stewards are there for your safety and you must follow their directions
 - Wear gloves
 - Always skate in an anti-clockwise direction
 - Report all accidents to a member of staff
 - All skaters should skate within their limitations. Speed skating or other dangerous activity is not permitted and will result in ejection.
 - Do not sit or climb on the safety barrier
 - The throwing of snow or ice and the chipping or digging of holes in the ice is strictly prohibited and will result in ejection.
 - Do not smoke, drink or eat on the ice
 - Do not drop litter on the ice
 - Do not carry young babies or young children on the ice
 - Chains of skaters must not consist of more than four people
 - Do not skate under the influence of alcohol or drugs
7. Mobile phones, cameras and personal music players are not permitted on the ice.
 8. The management reserves the right to restrict the number of people on the ice.
 9. The Management do not take any responsibility for personal belongings and belongings are left at their own risk.
 10. No animals are permitted onto the rink except registered assistance dogs.
 11. Security officers are entitled to search visitors and their belongings.
 12. Prohibited items include but shall not be restricted to glass, bottles, cans, alcohol, laser pens, illegal substances or any items deemed to be a potential weapon or threat to public safety.
 13. Photography/images which may identify individuals may only be taken on/around the rink for friends and family type purposes. If staff suspect someone is taking photographs/images for other purposes they may be asked to leave.

Note that all persons wishing to take photographs/images for professional use or for purposes other than as stated above must obtain prior written consent from Manchester City Council Events Unit. Any unauthorised photography or filming will result in ejection.
 14. All persons entering the rink consent to any photography, filming and recording as authorised by Manchester City Council for possible future transmission or promotional purposes.
